
STEP 1 - ASSEMBLING THE BLIND

Carefully unwrap the blind components. Unravel all guides and control cords. The blind will have the top and bottom parts of the frame attached with a cord. Lay out the blind face down on a clean, even surface.



To build the frame, select the left-hand frame component and guide onto the exposed arm of the bottom left corner joint. Slide the frame onto the arm until secure. Repeat the process on the top left-hand corner joint.


Now follow the same procedure for the right-hand side of the frame. Once the structure is complete, tighten the securing screws attached to each corner joint.




Your Perfect Fit Blind is now ready to be fitted.

STEP 2 - FITTING THE BLIND




The correct position to fit your brackets is 85mm from beading. To help find the correct position, simply lay a credit card in the corner of your window.



Slot a bracket into the corner of each gasket seal on the top window. Repeat for the bottom window.

TIP: Using a lubricant such as washing up liquid aids the brackets to slot into place.



Once all brackets are in place the blind is ready to be installed. Line the cut out in the bottom of the frame with the bottom brackets and clip in to place.

Repeat for the top window. Your Perfect Fit Blind is now installed.

VENETIAN BLINDS ONLY



Attach the plastic wand by hooking the wand onto the tilt mechanism on the Venetian Blind. Simply twist the wand to open and close the slats.

CHILD SAFETY



WARNING

Whilst Perfect Fit blinds are child safe by design, as with all window dressings they still pose a risk if used unsafely or installed in an unsafe location.

To ensure your blind is as safe as possible please ensure all beds, cots or furniture that can be climbed is moved away from the window.

While these blinds do pose minimal risk in regards to choking or strangulation they can still be pulled off the brackets and cause a risk of crushing or injury.

If the blind is pulled from the window frame, ensure there is no damage, and push the frame back onto your brackets.
